# Staffing Update

There is provision in place for children who require additional support for their learning during the interim period. I will keep you posted as we continue the recruitment process. I'm really pleased to share with you that Mrs Sharp, currently working in the office as clerical assistant, has accepted a secondment for the role of Administrative Assistant at another cluster school. This is quite a different post and she is really excited about the secondment opportunities this can offer her. This news is hot off the press and I will keep you up to date as details are finalised for her new role and for us moving forward with the recruitment process.

We would like to welcome Mrs Yunzhao Fan to the school. Mrs Fan is a Hanban Teacher joining us, on a Tuesday and Wednesday over this coming term. She will be working with all the teachers and children across the school. Hanban teachers are a team of highly skilled teachers on secondment from their regular teaching positions in schools across China. I would like to thank Mrs Henderson for coordinating this opportunity for our classes.

### In Service Day School Improvement Update.

We continue to look at Technologies in more depth. Both infant and upper stages have been working towards profiling with the children. P1-3 will be using a new part of the Online Learning Journal to capture children's views about their learning. P4-7 have now set up e-portfolios for profiling within Glow. By the February weekend, all pupils within P4-7 will be logging into these and beginning to personalise and populate their own profile -you may have already seen this! I have worked with Parent Council to produce an information leaflet on Reporting and Profiling that has now been issued to explain both processes and what we are doing at Low Port.

We also have been continuing our cluster work with our partners in the Educational Psychology Team around professional enquiry. There are many exciting research projects going on in classes across the school and cluster.

### Celebrating our Learning Event

I would like to thank you for your support, feedback and kind comments at our Literacy Across Learning event. It was wonderful that so many of you could come along and visit classrooms to see how literacy features in a range of learning contexts. We had all kinds of activities including:- active literacy and play; paired reading; literacy circles; literacy with health and wellbeing; profiling; active spelling; Spanish; Mandarin. Pupils demonstrated their reading, writing, listening and talking skills supported by a range of technologies too. As modern languages comes under literacy, it was wonderful that two classes shared their learning in this area too. We are collating the feedback and take on board comments and ideas for future sessions.

### School Show

Our school show is now well underway for P5 and P6! Show dates are 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> February, both evening performances from 6.30pm. Further information regarding tickets will follow.

## Anytime, Anywhere Learning (AAL) Update

Staff, pupils (through pupil council) and parents (through Parent Council) views have been gathered relating to AAL, focusing on the opportunities and challenges this may offer learners. Following this, we will draft guidance and agreements to be shared with pupils and parents. We have a range of tablets, netbooks and laptops in all classes which will enable all children to access AAL without bringing in devices from home.
