<u>Literacy</u>

- Spelling Patterns Learn previous spelling patterns from homework jotters.
- Choose a book to read for enjoyment and write a review about it including a picture of your favourite scene.
- A-Z of adjectives challenge E.g. Kinds of cats angry, awkward cat, beautiful black cat, cheeky cheerful cat, etc. This could be designed as a poster with attractive and detailed illustrations.
- Write a persuasive letter to a friend inviting them for a sleepover. Try to include three paragraphs and correct layout - address, date, dear, from.
- Write a wintry poem and illustrate.
- Look through one of your favourite books and make a list of WOW vocabulary, openers and connectives. Make sentences of your own using the words you have found.

Numeracy

- $\underline{P3}$ be able to recite fluently the 2,3,4,5 and 10 times tables plus number facts to 20.
- <u>P4</u> be able to recite fluently the 6 9 times tables plus number facts to 20.
- By using recipes to make a cake or meals, follow instructions regarding weighing and measuring of ingredients. Take a photo of your dish and write a paragraph about how you made it.
- Make sums into problems or stories for challenging a friend to solve.
- Play a game like Snakes and Ladders (counting forwards and backwards) or Scrabble where points need to be added up.
- Explore maths websites and be ready to share any really good ones you found.

Social Studies

- Choose a Scandinavian country, research and create a fact file. Compare their weather to ours here in Scotland. For example how do they cope in wintry weather? Does their daily life change in the winter?
- Write a personal diary of your adventures during the snowy days.
- Make a booklet for the class on one aspect of your current topic.

<u>Art</u>

- Design and make a Christmas decoration. Write down instructions detailing how your decoration is made draw labelled diagrams to illustrate or take a photograph.
- Make a 'Wintry Scene' picture.
- Design an outfit that will keep you warm in the winter weather. Add explanations of what it is made of and the special features it has to enable you to keep warm.
