School Improvement Update

The focus group of pupils that are reviewing our curriculum rationale has been using How Good Is Our School to investigate what we are doing well, how do we know and what could we make even better. Learning conversations for November with other children across all classes also focused on the same themes to ensure that we have a range of views represented. All of this self-evaluation will inform the revised curriculum rationale. Further updates will follow in due course.

Our Friday afternoon training sessions have been very busy this term. Along with cluster schools from Winchburgh and Linlithgow Bridge Primaries, all Low Port teachers took part in professional learning around higher order comprehension strategies for reading led by our colleagues in the Literacy Base in West Lothian. Our next steps are to use the ideas in the training next term to plan, assess and moderate a series of reading lessons together across levels with a focus on critical literacy. All staff have also renewed their Emergency First Aid training with a practical session together last week. Let's hope we don't need to apply these skills in the near future!

This Friday we continue cluster partnership working looking at progression in numeracy, planning learning in a context together for moderation across the cluster.

Enterprise Evening

We are all very busy preparing for Enterprise Night on Thursday 6 December 6.30pm-7.30pm. As part of their learning, all classes are planning a class enterprise using £25 gifted from FLPPS to make their money grow! Based on feedback from the day, we will be sending out copies of the programme outline in more depth, upload the powerpoint used onto the website and send out the parent leaflet. What a turnout! We had in excess of 70 parents and carers join us. Your support is greatly appreciated.

Charity Focus for this Session

Pupils decided that our national charity this year would be Children in Need. Thank you for your support with this. Several VLG groups are looking into more local charities as part of their work, particularly linked to children's mental health, which ties in with the health and well-being development work within school this year. Swimming

Suzie won gold in breaststroke and silver in butterfly which means that she qualifies to enter the Scottish Schools Championships in January 2019 for Low Port Primary. Skiing continues to flourish at Low Port with more than 120 children from across the Linlithgow cluster schools taking part in the Friday Cluster Club and really enjoying it. The challenge is to keep this enthusiasm going and watch the kids gain confidence and support

their progress from mat to mountain. There are a number of schools competitions both on the local dry slopes and snow.

On Wednesday (28th November) the Low Port School team competed in the Scottish Schools Snowsports Association ski/boarder cross event at Braehead. This was our first time at this competition and all members of the team did very well with Lexi (P6) finishing 5th and Nuala (P7) 10th in the girls event and Hamish (P6) and David (P6) finishing in the top half out of more than 200 children at the event. Overall the Low Port team finished in a very credible 9th place out of 21 teams.

A highlight of the school skiing calendar in December is the annual Boyd Anderson Competition held at Hillend and Low Port plan to enter two teams, one for experienced skiers and one for novices. Watch this space for further information.

As nights draw in the Scottish Schools alpine event is looming on the horizon. This year we plan to enter teams in the heats held at the Nevis Range. The heats at the Nevis Range are less busy than other centres and it has an excellent snow record as well the benefit of affordable accommodation which can be easily cancelled if there is no snow. We are also hoping to include snow training in the run up to the Alpine event.

Learning Updates

Bikeability for P5

We have been lucky to have Nicola Fell from West Lothian Leisure LTD delivering bikeability to P5. They are all on track to complete level 1 before Christmas and we are grateful to Nicola for providing this opportunity.

Animation

Animation Jam and Linlithgow Heritage Trust supported P5 in making short animated films based on historical artefacts found within Linlithgow. The class learned about places, people, objects and occupations from the past and compared them to the present day. Groups within the class created their own 2D character puppets and backgrounds, moving them and taking 100s of single photos in sequence to create animated scenes of action and re-enactment. The groups recorded their voices to put onto the characters and their animations came to life. The resulting film will be screened in 2019 at the museum opening!

Pupil Council Update - Plastic campaign

Pupil council updated our school at assembly on the campaign we began last year to reduce the use of unnecessary plastic in our school and town. We wrote to local businesses and visited them to ask them to review their provision of disposable plastic such as straws. We were happy to note some changes in policy at some establishments and happy to hear that some already had plans in place to reduce the use of plastic. It was also very interesting to hear the financial and business point of view on these issues. This year we are continuing to liaise with the council and are expecting a visit to our school for the council to conduct an audit and advise on any further action we can take to help with this effort. All classes have been invited to take their own water bottle to the lunch hall and please remember to bring a water bottle to the Christmas parties.
