### Learning Updates

#### P6 Song writing

Linlithgow Museum have been running activities in the run up to the Museum opening next year. We have already worked in partnership with them with P5 making animations. P6 have just started an exciting singer-songwriter project.

The project runs from January-March with a singer-songwriter to create a song about the history of Linlithgow and the surrounding area. The children will work on writing the new songs through workshops and then take part in a recording session. The songs will be put onto a CD for the pupils and they will also get a chance to perform at the opening of the new Museum. The singer-songwriter Caro Overy and she is working with the class teachers to make sure that workshops/rehearsals were planned and agreed in advance. Look out for ongoing updates on Twitter!

They organised a visit to the Caring Café which is held on Wednesday's at Low Port Centre for people affected by memory loss or who have a diagnosis of Alzheimers, and their carers. ### **Wider Achievements**

#### **Swimming**

Suzie in P7 qualified to enter the Scottish Schools Championships and represents Low Port Primary later this month. We will keep you posted on the outcome. Good luck Suzie!

#### **Ski Club**

At the beginning of December the fiftieth anniversary of the Boyd Anderson Trophy took place; a Lothian Schools Ski Competition, which is held at Hillend to commemorate George Boyd Anderson whose vision was to make snowsports accessible to all.

This year, for the first time, nine teams from the Linlithgow Cluster Schools Ski Club competed at this event. There were two Primary levels: the Boyd Anderson for experienced skiers and Novice for those who have skied for less than one year. There were Experienced and Novice teams from Torphichen, Low Port and Springfield Primaries. In the Secondary competition Linlithgow Academy had 3 teams entered: a Boyd Anderson team, a Girls team and a Boys team.

Torphichen Primary continued their successful run by winning Gold in the Boyd Anderson event and Low Port narrowly missed out on a podium place coming fourth. Nuala Maxwell from Low Port Primary was second fastest racer in the whole competition, younger sister Lexi was third fastest.

In the Novice event it was Low Port Primary's turn to shine as their novices won Gold. Finlay Thomas from Low Port was the fastest novice in the competition. Torphichen Primary medalled again by taking the bronze in the novice section. Springfield Primary Novices just missed out on a podium position by coming fourth - which was a great achievement given that this was their first ever competitive schools race.

Of the three teams from Linlithgow Academy, the Girls' team and the Boys' team won silver medals whilst the Boyd Anderson team was placed 6th.

The Cluster Schools Ski Club has lessons for all levels of skier and we try to accommodate those who would like to race and those who would like a more recreational pace. We are also looking for sponsorship if any parents are interested please get in touch.

Weather permitting at the end of January teams from Low Port Primary will be competing in the snow at the Nevis range in the Scottish Schools Snowsports Association Alpine Event.
