

## LPPS Suggested Homework Activities

### MATHS

Make sums into problems or stories.  
Practise similar sums playing a game online.  
Make up more sums of your own for a partner to solve.  
Time yourself – can you beat the timer saying tables or number bonds?  
Devise a problem solving task to share with your group.  
Devise new methods to learn your tables.  
Play a game like snakes and ladders that requires counting backwards and forwards or Scrabble where points need to be added up.

### SPELLING

Copy key words on your book or a computer.  
Ask someone to test you on the words.  
Play hangman.

Make a wordsearch/crossword/anagrams for a partner to solve.  
Write the words in alphabetical order.  
Across and down – write each word across and down sharing a beginning letter.  
Headlines – cut letters from newspapers to spell your words and glue into your jotter.  
Rainbow words – write your word and trace it 5 times using a different colour each time.  
Write each word using fancy letters.  
Write out your words and circle all the consonants.  
Write out your words and trace over the vowels in a coloured pencil.  
Write your words in a pyramid.  
Super sentences – write your words in a super sentence or paragraph.  
Break each word into syllables.  
Create an acrostic poem or mnemonic for your words.  
Website – tutpup spelling
