Staffing Update

We would like to welcome Mrs Marian McPhillips to the staff team. Mrs McPhillips will be working as a Pupil Support Worker, including the safe arrivals on a Friday morning from 8.30am. All children have already met her at assembly last week.

After the Easter break. Mrs Golding will be working Monday to Thursday only. The office will be manned Mrs Miller on Fridays as she extends her hours to cover Mrs Golding. Please bear with us during the period of transition and be aware that on occasion there may be only one person in the office.

School Improvement Update

Our most recent staff training has been focusing on raising attainment in writing, with external training and target setting. We have bought a new resource, PM Writing, that links very well to the benchmarks for functional writing and has a proven track record for improving writing across all levels.

At the February in service day, all staff had training around Looked After Children; GTCS training and changes to career long professional learning; discussion around the new Regional Improvement Collaborative and how they can help us raise attainment at Low Port; Rights Respecting Schools development work. We also spent the afternoon exploring the Digital Literacy Audit to see where we are currently and to identify next steps for our improvement plan next session. We also spent time as a staff team sharing our own areas of expertise within IT, with all staff looking at e-profiling, Cahoot, Glow tools and new interactive panel functions.

Whole School Sharing Learning Event

We will have our whole school event to share and celebrate our learning on Friday 10th May. The focus will be outdoor learning. Further information will follow. All classes will have some input around outdoor learning in term 4 too as part of our staff professional development programme.

School Show

This allows for sound checks, final preparations and getting the children ready as well as the after school club to leave. We do not have staff on site before this time. Should you wish your child to go from OOSC to us for the show, please let both school and OOSC know in advance.

School Fundraiser – Jaunt in Yer Jammies (Sponsored Walk)
