## **Exciting News!**

We have now received our Rights Respecting Schools Gold Award banner and certificate, which is displayed in the foyer.

We have also heard last week that Low Port Primary School has won the Enterprising School Award 2019! We are extremely proud of this, as it recognises all the hard work we have done around Developing Young Workforce and Careers Education, as well as our partnership work. A special thanks to FLPPS for supporting Enterprise Night, and to the Rotary Club for supporting Rotakids. There are many other partners who have contributed to our success and to enhancing the learning experiences of our children and we thank you all. Staff and some children will be attending an award ceremony on Friday 29<sup>th</sup> November.

#### Staffing Update

We have a student supporting learning working on Mondays and Fridays in P1 and P2. Mrs Marwan will be shadowing support staff and working with small groups of pupils, as well as assisting in the playground. Lucy Kilpatrick will also be returning as a student in her 4<sup>th</sup> year and be working with specific classes later this term and in to January.

#### School Improvement Update

Our In Service days have been very productive with joint cluster work on positive relationships supported by Pivotal Training. As a result of this training, and with the gathering of views from pupils and staff, we are reviewing our Positive Relationship Policy and moving away from Golden Time. All children have the right to play (Article 31 of the Rights of the Child) and classes will now all have Fun31 time with protected time for play, not linked to behaviour sanctions. A full consultation of the revised policy will come later this term.

As part of our improvement plan, we were successfully awarded a grant from Education Scotland to develop Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM). This grant is going to be used to develop staff training in both STEM and Mindset Maths.

STEM development work has begun with staff training within the Regional Improvement Collaborative partners. Mrs Johnston is taking the lead on this. She will have some development time to plan for STEM across the school and team teach later in the school session. We are also going to be working in partnership with Heriot Watt University with STEM in January, and with cluster schools and Academy staff at P6 with a K'nex Challenge and with P7 with a Formula 1 challenge.

Mindset Maths training has also launched. Mrs Livingston, Mrs Crawford and Miss Tully are working on this together. After Christmas, both class teachers will be taking forward a

professional enquiry project within their own practice linked to the learning. Later in the session, this will be shared with all staff.

Mrs McCartney and Miss Smith are both leading on the Tapestry programme. This is an 18 month programme with a specific focus on high quality learning and teaching. All staff have participated in the launch session with session two taking place before Christmas.

This term, we are working with all the cluster schools on moderating writing together so that there is a shared understanding of a child's progress across the cluster.

Copies of the School Improvement Plan and Standards and Quality Report are on our website, have been sent out via groupcall and are in our foyer.

#### Car Park Safety
